THE NEW RICHMOND THEATRE.

The new Theatre Royal and Opera House which has been erected for Mr F. C. Moullet, of the Castle and Greyhound Hotels, Richmond, was formally opened on Thursday evening by the Mayor of Richmond...

The new house is within a minute's walk of two railway stations, and conveniently situated to the omnibus termini, and stands immediately opposite an open space known as the Little Green... The main entrance, stands a figure representing Music, immediately beneath which the broadly-smiling face of Comedy looks out...
