We were in a state of limbo and attack.


An eternal Long Day's Journey into night.

If I were to tell the truth about me, I'd say I am old and young, that I open my arms to let you in, and, at the end of an evening, turn you away.



An historic theatre closely entwined with the lives of people in Glasgow, Scotland and beyond – it is the definition of living heritage.

We have partnered with the theatre over the last seven years, investing £7.7 million of funding to ensure this vivid heritage is protected and celebrated, but importantly that it is accessible and valued into the future.
